**Resolution To Unify and Resolve Disputes Between the
Elected State Central Committee and the Officers of the
Michigan Republican Party**

Whereas the 83-county parties in the State of Michigan, which are constitutional entities, come together in convention every February of odd-numbered years to create the Michigan Republican party; and

Whereas Elections held at the convention of February 2023 have consequences; and

Whereas the Officers and State Central Committee were elected by precinct delegates representing all Michiganders at the February 2023 Convention; and

Whereas the outcome of the election proved that the Michigan Republican Party is solidly in the hands of “We the People;” and

Whereas Chairwoman Karamo was left with credit cards and a line of credit, totaling \$640K in debt, to just \$300K in the bank, a \$340K deficit on day one and withheld the email contact list forcing the Karamo administration to start from scratch raising funds. The resulting financial disaster at the start was a breach of fiduciary duty by the previous administration. And the over \$7,000 a month burden of the Secchia-Weiser Republican Center building obligation, as verified by Matt DePerno, located at 520 Seymour Ave., Lansing Michigan; a building used by the previous administration and not by Kristina Karamo and her current administration, as it is cost prohibitive; and

Whereas in a recent email received from Matt DePerno, sent to all Republican chairs, it is his belief that “so long as MRP continues to target the autonomy of county parties, there will be no unity, there will only be continued litigation, tribalism, and internal disputes. This takes much needed time and resources away from the 2024 election.”

Whereas it is now 2024, it is vital we unite while we face the most important election in our history to save this country and to save the American dream; and

Now Therefore Be It Resolved, the St. Clair County Republican Party calls on the elected State Central Committee and the elected Officers, created from the authority of the county’s elected delegates, to agree to end all disputes at the State Central Committee meeting on January 13, 2024.
